But we can and what we will do is stand by their side for as long as it takes. Until they have peace in their country again.

Dear friends, This is what Europe is about – ensuring a safe and secure future for Europeans.

And that also means protecting those who provide for all of us. And this is why we have to support our farmers. They are the first to get up in the morning. They work hard for the high-quality food that we all enjoy. And at this point I want to pay respect to our farmers and thank them for their hard work.

Their costs for seeds, fertilizer and energy rise from year to year. But the prices they receive for milk, meat and grain are volatile. The big players in the food chain are putting pressure on them.

My friends, it cannot be right that farmers have to sell their food below production-cost. That is neither acceptable nor is it sustainable.

We also believe that fair competition with third countries need to be guaranteed. We need to put the system back on a solid footing.





The hard work of our farmers must pay off! And farmers are the best care-taker of nature, if the incentives are right. And this is our task for the next European budget.

And dear friends,

The exact same principle must apply to our fisher men and women. They work on our seas and oceans from morning to night. Coastal communities may be at the edge of our countries, but they are at the heart of our economies, our cultures and our way of life.

And this is particularly true in Galicia. From the picturesque beauty of O Barqueiro to the small fishing villages of Rinlo or Redes. Fisheries is a craft and a skill, a vocation and a profession passed down through generations of Galicians.

For decades, men and women in this region have helped to ensure food security. They provided a healthy and nutritious supply of seafood in local, national and even international markets.

Galicia accounts for around half of Spain's fishing fleet. And it is a perfect mix of tradition and progress. And it is our job to listen. And to ensure that fishing continues to be passed down through generations and continues to be an important provider of jobs.

This is why, if I am elected for a second term, I will task a full-time fisheries' commissioner to ensure fisheries remains a sustainable living for generations.

Dear friends, if I had to summarize in one word what Europe is all about I would say it is above all about our values. Europe is based on fundamental principles which define our common identity.

Europe has grown into a union founded on values in which we stand together: The defence of fundamental rights, equality, freedom, democracy and the rule of law.





This is what keep us together. This is what we stand for and this what we will defend at all times.

I know there are concerns in Europe about the rule of law. Let me be very clear: The Commission, as a guardian of the treaties, has the task to uphold those values. And Member States have to respect these common values on which our society is built, so that all citizens can fully enjoy the rights granted to them by the Union. And the Commission has always acted and will act to protect our citizens when these values are at stake. After all, we are a community of law. And the duty of the European Union is to protect against any threats. This is the foundation of everything we have achieved and everything we will do. It is Europe's hallmark.

Spain, like all Member States, can trust Europe.

Think of the pandemic.

Nobody expected Europe to be able to provide vaccines. But together we did it.
